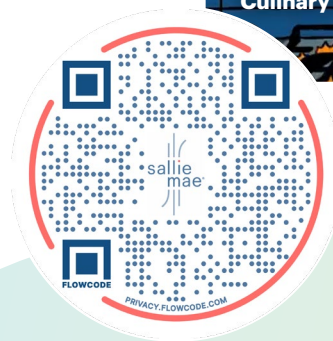

Grants are need-based—and the only way to see if you're eligible is by submitting the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA®).



ways you can get grant-ready

- 1** Find out if your state government has grants for residents attending in-state schools.
- 2** Submit your FAFSA® as soon as possible in December—some grants are given on a first-come, first-served basis.
- 3** Review the financial aid offers from the colleges you've been accepted to—they'll list any grants you're eligible to receive.
- 4** Check with the financial aid office at your school for any additional forms or info they require for the grants to be awarded.
- 5** Confirm whether or not your grant is renewable each year, and make sure you know what's needed for you to remain eligible.
